Investment objective

The Maestro Equity Prescient Fund will be a general equity portfolio. The Manager in selecting securities for the portfolio will seek to follow an investment policy which will secure for investors an optimum overall return, that is to say the steady growth of income and the preservation of capital in real terms. In order to achieve these main objectives, the investments to be acquired for the Maestro Equity Prescient Fund, shall comprise a mix of securities, financially sound ordinary shares, stock, financially sound preference shares, debenture stock, debenture bonds and unsecured notes as defined in the Act and the Deed, all to be acquired at a fair market value.

The Fund benchmark

The Fund will measure itself against the FTSE-JSE All Share Index. ASISA Classification: South African-Equity-General.

Legal structure

The Fund is a scheme in the nature of a trust known as a collective investment scheme. The portfolio manager is Maestro Investment Management (Pty) Ltd, an approved Financial Services Provider in terms of the Financial Advisory and Intermediary Services Act, operating under license number 739. This portfolio operates as a white label fund under the Prescient unit Trust Scheme, which is governed by the Collective Investment Schemes Control Act.

Fee structure

The maximum initial fee is 2.0%. The annual investment management fee is 1.75%. The annual total expense ratio (TER) for period ended 30 June 2023, in respect of class A was 2.28%.

Market Overview


Following a robust start to the year, it was inevitable that markets would experience a pullback, or at least a slowdown in their rate of appreciation. As it happens, we got a pullback. For some time now we have been highlighting the strength of the US economy, notwithstanding the rapid increase in interest rates between March 2022 and August 2023. Markets were sent lower in 2022 as investors digested the impact of this sharp increase, but during 2023 corporate earnings proved resilient and fears about further interest rate increases abated, providing the tailwind to lift markets to record levels. That momentum continued into the early months of 2024, but that economy has proved so resilient that investors have postponed all expectations of a reduction in interest rates until late in 2024. As data emerged to support this scaling back of expectations, bond yields have risen (and prices declined) and put pressure on equity markets in general, and growth and highly rated shares in particular. The MSCI World index fell 3.8% in April, led by the US market, which ended 4.0% lower. The Swiss market also fell 4.0%, while the German market fell 3.0% and the Japanese market 4.4%. The Indian and Chinese equity markets rose 1.3% and 3.1% respectively, helping the MSCI Emerging Market index to rise 0.5% despite a firm dollar; the greenback rose 1.6% in April on expectations of delayed US interest rate cuts. The bond market was under pressure, declining 2.5% in April to bring its decline for the year-to-date to 4.6%. Global equity markets have risen 4.3% so far this year. Despite the firm dollar, commodity prices ended the month mixed. The gold price rose to a record level, closing the month 5.4% higher. Perhaps the most notable increase was the one recorded in the price of copper; it ended the month 12.6% higher, after a 4.4% rise in March. The oil price eased slightly, despite ongoing heightened geopolitical concerns.

Local market returns

The All Share index rose 3.0%, despite a firm rand and declining developed markets. Gains were driven largely by the Basic Materials index, which ended the month 6.3% higher (it rose 13.4% in March). The Financial and Industrial indices ended the month higher too, rising 3.0% and 1.6% respectively. The All Bond index also defied weaker global bond markets, rising 1.4%. The rand ended the month on a strong note, rising 0.5% against a strong dollar, although most of this strength came late in the month as investors pre-empted the possible effects of a successful acquisition of Anglo by Billiton.

Investment Manager comment

During April, the Maestro Equity Prescient Fund *rose* 0.3%, versus the 3.0% rise in the All Share index. During the year ended 30 April, the Fund *rose* 8.6%, well ahead of the All Share index return of 1.1% over the same period.


The Fund's underweight exposure to the materials sector and its offshore exposure retarded the returns during the month. Richemont declined 8.3%, Standard Bank 4.4%, the CoreShares S&P500 ETF 4.2%, Ninety One 3.9%, the Sygnia MSCI US ETF 3.7%, Billiton 3.4%, and the Sygnia MSCI World index ETF also 3.4%.

The Fund adhered to its Policy objective during the month.




Historic sector allocation (% of Equity)
